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2018 Goals

 - > Drive feature enhancements for VPP, CICN, DMM, better ARM support, etc.
 - > Increased effort on Kubernetes/cloud native (mini summits at KubeCons below are key to this)
 - > On-going infra support (incl. for additional HW resources that were purchased or will be donated)
 - > Budget for PR's, mini summits, collaterals, etc.
 - Continue to build out <u>fd.io</u> training (incl. potentially EdX courses)
- > ODL (http://docs.opendaylight.org/en/latest/release-process/release-goals.html)
 - > Infrastructure efficiency: via XCI, OpenStack images via OPNFV, CSIT audit, regular IT cost feedback, etc.
 - Improving the release model
 - > Expanding contributor base (e.g. via downstream developers, better on-boarding/mentororship)
 - > Better support for docs & kernel project
 - Maintain DDFs



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2018 Goals

- > ONAP (https://wiki.onap.org/display/DW/2018+Plans)
 - > Production deployments
 - More integrated CI/CD with testing
 - > New programs for internship & academic outreach
 - > Budget for hackfests, "Design Summit", mini summits, etc.
- > OPNFV (https://wiki.opnfv.org/display/meetings/2018+Goals)
 - > Address new use cases and hardware deployments (e.g. Cloud Native, Edge, C-RAN/vCO, etc.)
 - > Refine OPNFV's mission and ways-of-working/processes (e.g. release process, dynamic lab resource allocation, etc.)
 - > Refine OPNFV output/artifacts so that OPNFV is more use-case driven and easier to consume
 - > Closer collaboration with LFN projects through XCI, LaaS, etc.
 - > Evolution of the OPNFV Verified Program and support LFN-level "umbrella" compliance program
 - > Maintain & grow our healthy community

 - > TSC composition: I I members elected on an annual basis and all contributors with a CLA are eligible
 - > Meetings: Most are weekly, but varying frequency for each group. All meetings are public including votes/minutes
 - > Governance documents: In Gerrit, Google docs, etc., but more work needs to be done
