 - CNF to specific platform 1:1 as a deployment requirement does not and cannot scale.
 - What is the highest priority activity that will reduce the cost due to rework for end users, platform vendors, workload (CNF) vendors?
- Day 2: ONAP/ECMO Alignment and Community Tooling and Documentation
 - ONAP/EMCO architecture, use case alignment, and deployment options
 - Documentation and tooling discussion follows from January plenary topic
