Code of Conduct

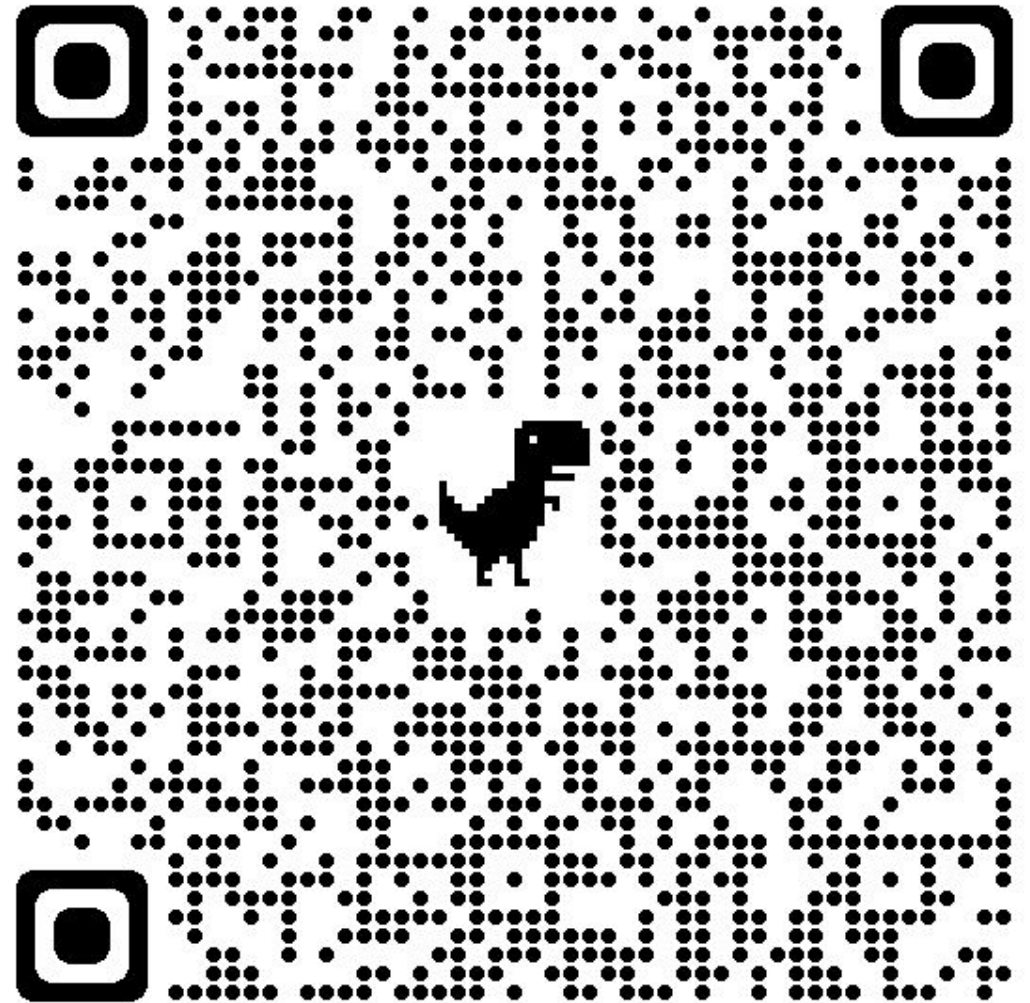
