





Code of Conduct




Event Survey

Key Findings from our Operations Survey




2023 Ops Survey

- LFN's annual Operations Survey was skipped in 2022 as we anticipated a much larger research study that got pushed to 2H 2023
 - Year over year trends provided in following charts
- The Ops Survey guides our team across different aspects of technical operations
- Some of the results are cross referenced against contribution trends reported from [LFX Insights](#)
- Response rate was 18% of LFN's Active Community Members*
 - Rate has slightly increased year over year since we first started surveying

*Defined as someone that made ≥ 20 measurable technical contributions of any type during the 2022 calendar year

Region As Reported From Survey vs. Percentage of Code Contribution By Region



This is an overlay of LFX commit data on survey response data, it is NOT a stacked bar chart



Guidance received from LFN


- Our communities remain generally satisfied with our support in this area

- We are very glad you see it as one of our strengths :-)



Staff Support Effectiveness

- Folks interacting with staff day-to-day seem satisfied with the support they are getting
- We don't know if "Don't Know" always exceeding 20% is a good or a bad indicator here :-}
- We may have had something to do with the big jump in "Don't Know" responses this time around
 - LFN's *Technical Program Managers* were all reclassified as *Technical Community Architects* between the 2021 survey and this one
 - It may not always be clear how to get administrative support

Cross Collaboration

- Collaboration remains top of mind for most people
- Folks are much less satisfied in this area year-over-year
- LFN staff's strategic role is to help *facilitate* collaboration
- *Should* be one of LFN's core strengths



Cross Collaboration was the pervasive tenor of this year's survey

In written comments cross Project collaboration towered above all else, with the majority of responses containing 2 or 3 of the 4 themes below:

- **Gratitude** for the number of cross collaboration opportunities we have provided for our communities
- **Confusion** over the fact that so few Projects actually took advantage the opportunities we have given them
- **Frustration** over external communities completely ignoring LFN Projects when our Projects have reached out to collaborate
- **Dismay** that new networking Projects are constantly launched outside of LFN; Joining LFN should be the default
