



Event Survey







- LFN depends upon this input to adapt and adjust these events to meet community needs

Cross Collaboration was the pervasive tenor of this year's survey



In written comments cross Project collaboration towered above all else, with the majority of responses containing 2 or 3 of the 4 themes below:

- Gratitude for the number of cross collaboration opportunities we have provided for our communities
- Confusion over the fact that so few Projects actually took advantage the opportunities we have given them
- Frustration over external communities completely ignoring LFN Projects when our Projects have reached out to collaborate
- Dismay that new networking Projects are constantly launched outside of LFN;
 Joining LFN should be the default

- What are some next steps and Als?


